\*TWR 360 is the digital arm of the ministry that has the potential to reach millions of men and women with the Gospel and discipleship resources. It has the ability to reach across national borders and past hostile governments to anyone, anytime, on any connected device.

\*In the 1970s the regime in power in Cambodia nearly destroyed the country, killing around 2 million people through execution, forced labor or starvation. Today Cambodia still struggles to meet basic needs for its people. Deep psychological scars remain and many still suffer stress related disorders. Cambodia's next generation is largely ignored or unwanted by adults. They are unable to send them to school, so they stay home tending siblings and doing housework. Seeing the desperate need of the nation's children, the TWR Cambodia team began producing *Happy Children's Garden*, a weekly 15-minute Bible story series, geared to reach children of all ages. It begins with creation and ends with Christ's

return. The programs are currently aired on FM stations throughout Cambodia. The TWR Cambodia Team also touches listener's lives through correspondence and rallies held in different villages where they learn more biblical lessons and receive gifts of basic hygiene items.

\*Africa Orality Projects - Unreached people groups. Visit a Hausa Village in West Africa and you will probably see a group of adults and children gathered around an elder telling a story. They are doing more than listening to a story, they are taking part in their cultural heritage. The Hausa are considered oral learners - that is storytelling, drama and other oral-teaching forms, even among those who are literate. The Hausa is also one of Africa's largest unreached people groups, with only .04% being evangelical Christians. Since more than 30 million Hausa live within range of TWR's West Africa transmitting station, TWR has developed innovative teaching programs in the Hausa language. Just last year almost 2500 Hausa listeners responded with testimonies like this one. *"Thank you. I got converted to Christianity through your programs. I was about to perish but your program set me free. Please pray for me because I want to understand what God requires from me since I received Him as my Lord and personal Savior."*

Again, thank you for standing with us and TWR these many years. This ministry is definitely a team effort and you are a very important part. We appreciate you all so very much. ☺ We are sending our love to each of you.
