Hello or Hafa Adai, as we say in Guam. It's been about three weeks since we arrived on the island. A lot has happened in that short period of time, and we will try to give you a brief recap.

When we first landed, we were warmly welcomed at the airport by our teammates. They were ready to embrace our crazy, tired crew, help us gather our luggage, and host us until we could get into our own home. Once our shipping container arrived, Cody and our teammate, Grant, went to port to line up delivery of our household goods. In the meantime, Cody got our new phones and numbers established, started looking for vehicles, and setup water and electricity to be ready once we moved into our rental home. We forgot how much it takes to get re-established in a new place, even the simple things that we once took for granted: having a mode of transportation to get groceries, or accessibility to a local phone number to make calls. It all takes time to do, and in some instances, a new way of doing it.

In the last week, we have been busy unpacking and making our house feel like a home. The girls have enjoyed getting settled into their new spaces; they had been eagerly awaiting decorating and organizing their bedrooms. We have also started meeting our neighbors, exploring the outdoors, going to local stores, trying new foods, visiting churches, taking a school tour, chasing geckos, and learning about the island's history, plants/animals, and culture.

The Lord has blessed us greatly during this time. Our teammates have walked alongside us as we transitioned in, and they have been wonderful resources in getting us settled. We are so grateful for them and honored to start ministry alongside them. When we pulled up to the KTWR station for the first time, we began walking around. As we gazed at the towers, antennas, and broadcasting equipment, the Lord impressed on us that He has done amazing things through this broadcasting sight and has an incredible fruitful future ahead!
