The new 200,000-watt AM transmitter added at the West Africa Transmitter Station is now broadcasting, but at reduced power. Larry, along with James Burnett from South Africa, plan to be there for two weeks in early February to attempt to bring this transmitter up to full power. Please **pray** that the manufacturer will be able to provide any needed instructions and parts, and for wisdom, safety and the success for this trip.

A 100,000-watt AM transmitter has been broadcasting from this location for 10 years and continues to do so.

**Cambodia** – Though surrounded by her four children, Chantou\* sat discouraged in her Cambodia village, feeling alone. Her husband had abandoned her and their family, and she couldn't shake the spirit of despair hovering over her.

"At that time, I was facing many problems in my life," she recalls. But supernatural virtue broke through during those dark days 15 years ago. Chantou was introduced to the Women of Hope program — produced by TWR and broadcast from a nearby local radio station. On August 28, 2004, she accepted Jesus Christ into her life. "He saved me from my sin," she says.

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, Chantou now radiates joy. She continues to grow spiritually as God gives her the strength to apply the lessons from his Word. To this day, she continues to listen to the Women of Hope program and is applying biblical truth to her daily life.

"My life is peaceful and joyful because of Jesus, who is my Savior," Chantou says. "I give thanks to the Lord, who gives me new life with him."

But the mother of four doesn't keep that good news to herself. She's reaching out to family and friends who need to hear about God's wondrous love and how Jesus died on a cross for their sins and was raised from the dead victorious on the third day.

"Now, I'm the one who shares the gospel with both kids and adults, unbelievers alike," Chantou proclaims.

**West Africa** – “When I first met my wife, she was a sweet woman, but a year after our marriage, I discovered a lioness in my house,” the man said. “She did everything as she wanted, nothing I had seen her doing before.”

**Sri Lanka** – Through the program, *God's Unique Book*, we see God at work in Sri Lanka. In a recent report we received prior to the April 21 blasts, we received many encouraging messages.

One listener called us saying: “*I'm 39 years old. I was addicted to alcohol for about 17 years and have tried to commit suicide several times. My family left me because of my addiction and debt. I live without any hope. While I was listening to your radio program, I heard that the presenter mentioned that "There's a hope in Jesus Christ." That word has touched my heart deeply. Christ has touched my heart when I listened to your program, and I have decided to be a follower of Christ.*”

Our follow-up team prayed for this listener, especially for his wife and children to return. After a week, they received a call from his wife. Praise God! She has returned home with the children and explained that he has become a totally different person. A pastor has connected with the family and has committed to stay in contact with them.
