Due to the government, it is almost impossible for believers to meet and gather together without causing suspicion and with that suspicion

comes the threat of death or imprisonment. Just having a Bible is cause for this kind of treatment, so how can they listen and learn about Christ?

TWR smuggles radios into N. Korea so that the Gospel can spread and the new believers can be disciplined. When we do this, we send them with sealable plastic bags that the radios fit in. These bags are sent so that after they are done listening, they can bury the radio until the next evening. These radios become the pastors and worship leaders to the believers that are in N. Korea. One of our listeners wrote to us and said, "Together we raise our voices in worship when the radio plays hymns, and we draw near to God when we listen to the messages." What an amazing display of the glory of God and His mighty power at work that though we physically cannot enter this country, due to immediate imprisonment or death, He has created radio waves so that we can spread His good news into the most closed country on this planet.

This is just a glimpse of the ministry that we are a part of at TWR. Please pray for the Church in N. Korea as they face persecution daily. Please pray for our team on Guam as they continue to keep the transmitters going despite these threats of bombing from N. Korea. Please pray for us as we continue to support those in Guam from the office in Cary. Thank you for your continued prayers; we cherish them greatly. Thank you also for your sacrifice monetarily; you are truly partners with us in this ministry and we could not do what we do without the finances that you provide.
