Tyler's Update:

A part of Tyler's role is to support and write reports based on the data inside of our donor system. He has been very busy the past couple of months working in coordination with the Donor Services and Spanish Department on improving the coding structure within the system to provide more accurate reports. He has enjoyed getting the information in a logical, organized manner that allows him to more accurately show progress TWR is making towards various projects around the globe. This has been a very interesting process that he has thoroughly enjoyed - yes, he is that nerdy.

Global Ministry Update:

At the end of January, TWR dedicated and turned on the brand new 500,000-watt transmitter on Bonaire! This has been a very large project that will result in the potential to reach 100 million people in Central and Latin America. The antenna system was upgraded this past year and we were able to go live on the air when the devastation of the hurricanes hit the Caribbean to encourage and counsel those who had lost everything. The signal was already stronger, and it is exciting to know that with the new transmitter an even larger number of people will be able to tune in and hear the Gospel! Below is a quote from a second-generation listener of our radio station located on Bonaire.

"Good morning. God bless you. My heart rejoices each day because Radio Trans Mundial [TWR in Spanish] has blessed my life. My father received Christ through this station 33 years ago, and from the time I was a little girl, I listened. I am very thankful that he taught me to listen. He is with the Lord, and now I teach my children to listen to you. I am a faithful listener of all the programs. My prayer to God is that He prosper you in this project as well as in your lives. I listen to you from Falcón, Punto Fijo, a small town called Tacuato."
